

EASEMENTS

A common question in the City is responsibility for maintaining of easements. Each lot in the City normally has a drainage easement along the back property line and utility (gas & electric) easements on the side of each lot.

The short answer is that an easement is still owned by you, and you must maintain it. An easement is only a right of use for a particular purpose. Easements still must be maintained like the rest of your yard, with few exceptions, that will be noted below.

Metropolitan Sewer District (MSD) is the agency in the county responsible for drainage and storm water control. Therefore, if something in the MSD easement was blocking the flow of water, MSD could enter its easement and remove the blockage. However, MSD is not going to perform routine maintenance in these drainage easements. The exception to this is for "major channels", which are defined as a large ditch (30 or more feet wide) draining water from several neighborhoods that cannot be maintained with normal lawn care equipment.

The same principals apply to the utility easements on the side of each lot. The easement allows LG&E to install and service its supply lines. However, LG&E is not required to cut the grass on either side of each lot in the City.

Drainage easement maintenance is important. Small things can pile up and then when a large rain event occurs, sticks, leaves and debris can accumulate at chokepoints and cause flooding. Regular maintenance of back yard drainage easements as part or your normal lawn maintenance makes a big difference during major storm events.




